# UNFPA to underscore centrality of maternal health, family planning to sustainable development at Women Deliver Conference

**UNITED NATIONS, Copenhagen/New York, 12 May 2016—**Maternal health and family planning are vital to realizing the social and economic well-being of women, girls, families, communities and nations, UNFPA, the United Nations Population Fund, will emphasize at next week's Women Deliver Conference in Copenhagen, Denmark. These issues urgently require more commitment from the international community.

The 16-19 May Fourth Women Deliver Conference is billed as the world's largest global conference on health, rights and well-being of women. It will bring together thousands policymakers, advocates and researchers on women's health and empowerment.
